## Tell me more about refugee foster youths.

Each year, countless refugee youths are driven from countries for reasons of persecution. Many are alone, separated from family or orphaned by war. They can’t go home, and they can’t stay where they are.

These are children in flight. They long for safety, care, family, and a place to call home. You can help. Welcome a refugee youth into your family.

## Who can be a refugee foster parent?

We seek warm-hearted, internationally-minded families to welcome a refugee youth into their homes. You can be single or married; from a large family or have no children at all; and of any race, religion, or ethnic background.

## How will you foster a youth in my home?

- Close case management with program staff
- Educational support, such as tutoring and assessment
- Wellness services
- Preparation for eventual independence, such as classes in money management, employment preparation and more
- Cultural, educational, and recreational activities

## How will you assist refugee foster parents?

- Reimbursement for the costs of fostering a youth (food and clothing)
- Support from caseworkers and social workers
- Monthly training sessions
- Opportunities for cross-cultural exchange and to share experiences with other refugee foster parents.
